| General | <b>Description:</b> |

This bill creates the Rural School Sports Facilities Grant Program.

### **Highlighted Provisions:**

- 7 This bill:
  - defines terms:
- 9 • creates the Rural School Sports Facilities Grant Program to fund the construction or 10 refurbishment of sports facilities in rural public schools;
- 11 • requires the Utah State Board of Education to administer the program;
  - allows a local education agency to apply for funds from the program;
  - requires the state board to report on the program upon request; and
  - makes technical changes.

#### **Money Appropriated in this Bill:**

This bill appropriates \$4,390,000 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2026, all of which is from the various sources as detailed in this bill.

#### 18 **Other Special Clauses:**

This bill provides a special effective date.
