Department of Agriculture - Spay/Neuter Fund

- FOR the purpose of altering the contents and authorized uses of the Spay/Neuter Fund; requiring the Department of Agriculture to establish a process through which a person may make a voluntary donation to the Fund; requiring the Department to give additional consideration to certain competitive grant proposals that meet certain criteria; altering a certain fee on commercial feed prepared and distributed for consumption by dogs or cats and registered in the State in a certain manner; and generally relating to the Spay/Neuter Fund.

- 2 (b) The fee established under subsection (a) of this section shall be paid by the 3 person registering the commercial feed in accordance with the collection and reporting 4 guidelines established by the Department by regulation.
- 5 (c) Any fee collected under this section shall be paid into the Fund.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2024.
