## A BILL ENTITLED

**Nuclear Energy Development Task Force** 

1 AN ACT concerning

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3 4 5 6 7	FOR the purpose of establishing the Nuclear Energy Development Task Force to study and make recommendations on the deployment of nuclear power generation resources and other related technologies in the State and the establishment of a permanent nuclear energy commission in the State; and generally relating to the Nuclear Energy Development Task Force.
8 9	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
10	(a) There is a Nuclear Energy Development Task Force.
11 12	(b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Task Force consists of the following members:
13 14	(i) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
15 16	(ii) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
17 18	(iii) the Director of the Maryland Energy Administration, or the Director's designee;
19 20	(iv) the Chairman of the Public Service Commission, or the Chairman's designee;
21 22	(v) the Director of the State Department of Assessments and Taxation, or the Director's designee;



- 1 (vi) one representative of the Maryland Association of Counties from 2 a suburban county, selected by the Maryland Association of Counties;
- 3 (vii) one representative of the Maryland Association of Counties from 4 a rural county, selected by the Maryland Association of Counties;
- 5 (viii) one representative of the Maryland Association of Counties from 6 an urban county, selected by the Maryland Association of Counties;
- 7 (ix) two representatives of organized labor, selected by the Maryland 8 State and District of Columbia AFL—CIO;
- 9 (x) one representative of the Office of People's Counsel, selected by 10 the People's Counsel;
- 11 (xi) two representatives of the construction industry selected as 12 follows:
- 13 one representative selected by the Maryland Minority 14 Contractors Association; and
- one representative selected by the Associated Builders and Contractors of Maryland;
- 17 (xii) one representative of the Maryland Municipal League, selected 18 by the Maryland Municipal League;
- 19 (xiii) one representative from the Maryland Energy Innovation 20 Institute, selected by the Maryland Energy Innovation Institute;
- 21 (xiv) one representative from each investor—owned electric company 22 in the State, selected by the president of each investor—owned electric company;
- 23 (xv) the Chief Executive Officer of the Virginia, Maryland and 24 Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives, or the Chief Executive Officer's designee;
- 25 (xvi) the President of the Maryland–District of Columbia Utilities 26 Association, or the President's designee;
- 27 (xvii) the Chief Nuclear Officer from Calvert Cliffs Nuclear Power 28 Plant, or the Chief Nuclear Officer's designee;
- 29 (xviii) two representatives of environmental advocacy groups, 30 appointed by the Governor; and
- 31 (xix) two engineers appointed by the Governor as follows:

3	2. one engineer with system development experience.
4 5	(2) The Governor shall request that the following individuals and representatives be designated as members of the Task Force:
6 7	(i) the Executive Director of the United States Nuclear Industry Council, or the Executive Director's designee;
8 9 10	(ii) one representative from a U.S. Department of Energy national laboratory with expertise in nuclear energy policy, selected by the U.S. Department of Energy;
$\frac{1}{2}$	(iii) one representative of the Nuclear Energy Institute, selected by the President of the Nuclear Energy Institute; and
13 14	(iv) one representative from a national nuclear educational nonprofit organization, selected by the American Nuclear Society.
15 16	(c) To the extent practicable, the membership of the Task Force shall reflect the gender, racial, ethnic, and geographic diversity of the State.
17 18	$\mbox{(d)}  \mbox{The Director of the Maryland Energy Administration shall designate the chair of the Task Force.}$
9	(e) The Maryland Energy Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force.
20	(f) A member of the Task Force:
21	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but
22 23	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
24	(g) The Task Force shall:
25 26 27	(1) identify the barriers to the deployment of nuclear power generation resources and other related technologies in the State, including regulatory, statutory, financial, social, environmental, workforce, and educational barriers;
28 29 30	(2) develop recommendations that a permanent nuclear energy commission may use to address the barriers to the deployment of nuclear power generation and other related technologies in the State;

consult with any federal, state, or local agencies, nonprofit

1 organizations, private industry representatives, or other stakeholders on the role of a 2permanent nuclear energy commission in the State; 3 study whether different types of incentives should be created for different levels of nuclear development, including customer-sited residential and 4 nonresidential, aggregated net metered, community nuclear, and utility scale nuclear, 5 based on cost variance and other factors; and 6 7 make recommendations on incentives and other actions needed for the 8 deployment of nuclear power generation resources and other related technologies in the State, including incentives and other actions to ensure: 9 10 that the State meets its net-zero greenhouse gas emissions goals established in § 2–1204.2 of the Environment Article; 11 12 (ii) effective participation from minority business enterprises in 13 nuclear development in the State; 14 that nuclear development in the State: (iii) 15 1. creates high-quality jobs with family-sustaining wages; 16 and 17 2. includes training and outreach to communities where nuclear energy is generated or being developed; 18 19 (iv) equitable access to renewable energy in the State; and 20 the efficient use of land in the State through maximizing the (v) 21production of nuclear energy on previously developed property. 22On or before December 30, 2025, the Task Force shall submit a report 23on its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly. 2425The report shall include recommendations for the creation of a 26 permanent nuclear energy commission in the State, including recommendations on: 27 the organizational placement of the commission within a unit of (i) 28 the State: 29staffing needs of the commission; (ii) 30 (iii) the mission statement and short- and long-term goals of the commission; and 31

the role of the commission in fostering the development of the

- 2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 3
  - 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 1 month and, at the end of June
- 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 4
- abrogated and of no further force and effect. 5
