SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: (a) There is a Task Force on Recycling Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland. (b) The Task Force consists of the following members: (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate: (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House: (3) the Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee; and
