To prohibit the destruction of civil rights memorials, and for other purposes.

Mr. Cohen (for himself, Mr. Bishop of Georgia, Mr. Carson, Ms. Norton, and Ms. Lee of California) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

To prohibit the destruction of civil rights memorials, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Civil Rights Legacy
- 5 Protection Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON DESTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PROP-
- 7 **ERTY.**
- 8 (a) In General.—Chapter 65 of title 18, United
- 9 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 10 lowing:

## 1 "§ 1370. Prohibiting destruction of civil rights memo2 rials

- "(a) DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY.—Whoever, in a 3 circumstance described in subsection (b), intentionally de-4 5 faces, damages, or destroys a protected memorial under subsection (c) or any structure, plaque, statue, or monu-6 7 ment on public property that commemorates a covered civil rights event or a covered civil rights figure shall— 8 9 "(1) in the case that such defacement, damage, or destruction is in an amount that is equal to or 10 11 less than \$5,000, be required to complete up to 300 12 hours of community service, fined under this title, or 13 imprisoned not more than a year; or
- "(2) in the case that such defacement, damage, or destruction is in an amount that is more than \$5,000, be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 3 years.
- 18 "(b) CIRCUMSTANCES.—A circumstance described in 19 this subsection is that—
- 20 "(1) in committing the offense described in sub-21 section (a), the defendant travels or causes another 22 to travel in interstate or foreign commerce, or uses 23 the mail or an instrumentality of interstate or for-24 eign commerce; or
- 25 "(2) the structure, plaque, statue, or monument 26 described in subsection (a) is located on property

14	"(d) Restitution.—Whoever is convicted of an of-
15	fense under this section shall be ordered to pay restitution.
16	"(e) Covered Events and Figures.—In this sec-
17	tion—
18	"(1) the term 'covered civil rights figure' means
19	any figure on the list submitted by the United
20	States Commission on Civil Rights pursuant to sec-
21	tion 3(a) of the Civil Rights Legacy Protection Act;
22	and
23	"(2) the term 'covered civil rights event' means
24	any event on the list submitted by the United States

1	Commission on Civil Rights pursuant to section 3(a)
2	of the Civil Rights Legacy Protection Act.".
3	(b) Table of Sections.—The table of sections for
4	chapter 65 of title 18, United States Code, is amended
5	by adding at the end the following item:
	"1370. Prohibiting destruction of civil rights memorials.".
6	SEC. 3. UNITED STATES COMMISSION ON CIVIL RIGHTS.
7	(a) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the
8	date of enactment of this Act, the United States Commis-
9	sion on Civil Rights shall develop and submit to the Attor-
10	ney General a list of covered civil rights events and covered
11	civil rights figures as follows:
12	(1) Covered civil rights event.—For pur-
13	poses of developing a list of covered civil rights
14	events, the United States Commission on Civil
15	Rights shall include on the list any event that—
16	(A) memorializes the struggle to secure
17	equal rights for groups suffering from discrimi-
18	nation on the basis of race, religion, disability,
19	gender identity, or sexual orientation during the
20	Civil Rights Movement and other social move-
21	ments; and
22	(B) left a positive impression on a unit of
23	local government, a State, or the United States.
24	(2) Covered civil rights figure.—For pur-
25	poses of developing a list of covered civil rights fig-

1 ures, the United States Commission on Civil Rights 2 shall include on the list any person who— 3 (A) is known for dedication and advocacy 4 toward expanding personal civil liberties and ending racial and other forms of discrimination, 6 disenfranchisement, and segregation; or 7 (B)(i) worked to secure equal rights for 8 groups suffering from discrimination on the 9 basis of race, religion, disability, gender iden-10 tity, or sexual orientation during the Civil 11 Rights Movement and other social movements; 12 and 13 (ii) has left a positive impression and leg-14 acy on a unit of local government, a State, or 15 the United States. 16 (b) Modifications to List.—The United States Commission on Civil Rights shall review annually and modify as necessary the list submitted by the Commission 18 19 pursuant to (a). 20 (c) Publishing List.—The Attorney General shall 21 ensure that the list submitted by the United States Commission on Civil Rights pursuant to subsection (a), and any modifications made by the Commission pursuant to

- 1 subsection (b), shall be made available to the public on
