- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing, in the Town of Kensington in Montgomery County, the 5 Board of License Commissioners for Montgomery County to renew, approve the 6 transfer of, and otherwise provide for certain licenses; repealing a limitation on the 7 number of a certain license that the Board may issue in the Town of Kensington; 8 altering the number of Class A-K beer and wine licenses the Board may issue; 9 authorizing the issuance of not more than a certain number of Class 9 limited 10 distillery licenses for use in the town; authorizing the Board to alter the number of 11 Class A-K license holders under certain circumstances; expanding the hours of sale 12 for Class A-K license holders; specifying an annual fee for certain licenses; requiring that certain license holders maintain a percentage of daily sales from food; 13 prohibiting certain license holders from posting certain signage; and generally 14 relating to alcoholic beverages in Montgomery County. 15
