1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County – Alcoholic Beverages – Board of License Commissioners –**
3 **Qualifications**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that each member of the Board of License Commissioners for
5 Baltimore County be a resident and voter of Baltimore County; and generally
6 relating to the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

21 (a) In this title:

22 (1) the definitions in § 1–101 of this article apply without exception or
23 variation; and

(2) the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) “Board” means the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County.

13–102.

This title applies only in Baltimore County.

13–202.

(a) The County Executive shall appoint three members to the Board.

(b) **EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE A RESIDENT AND VOTER OF THE COUNTY.**

(C) (1) The term of a member is 2 years.

(2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 2016.

[(c)] (D) The County Executive may remove a member for misconduct in office, incompetence, or willful neglect of duty.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
