WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States are like-minded in that both deeply cherish the common values of freedom, democracy, human rights, and the rule of law; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan has been experiencing continuous threats from the neighbor of China, which has encroached on Taiwan's security by flying in Taiwan's air defense identification zone, disseminating disinformation, launching cyber attacks, and repeatedly excluding Taiwan from the international system, as demonstrated through its denial of Taiwan's participation in the World Health Assembly; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, the United States and Taiwan have experienced strengthening in bilateral relations; the State Department loosened restrictions on official contacts with Taiwan; both sides resumed the eleventh Trade and Investment Framework Agreement Council meeting; the United States continues to approve its arms sales to Taiwan, demonstrating that the United States has always placed great importance on Taiwan's defense capabilities; Taiwan and the United States, along with Japan, welcomed Australia as the fourth official partner of the Global Cooperation and Training Framework; most

3	WHEREAS, Taiwan has contributed extensive resources
4	to help the international community, including the United
5	States, to combat the COVID-19 pandemic through the global
6	donation of tens of million of surgical and N95 masks,

8	thousands of thermometers, reciprocally, the United States has
9	donated 4 million doses of the Moderna vaccine to Taiwain; and
10	WHEREAS, Taiwan ranks as the second-freest country
11	in Asia, scoring 94 out of 100 and seventh in the world in
12	Freedom House's latest report on global freedom; and
13	WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' ninth-largest
14	trading partner, and the United States is Taiwan's
15	second-largest trading partner; Taiwan supports an estimated
16	330,000 jobs in the United States; Taiwan is the 15th largest
17	export market of Alabama, Alabama's 12th largest import
18	country, investing \$16 million to Alabama and supporting an
19	estimated 1,551 jobs in Alabama; recently, South Carolina, New
20	Mexico, Montana, and Pennsylvania have established trade
21	offices in Taiwan to attract more investments; and
22	WHEREAS, Alabama welcomes all opportunities for an
23	even closer partnership on business, educational, cultural,
24	and people-to-people exchanges between the citizens of both

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That it encourages the members of this body to join the Southeastern State Legislative Taiwan Caucus (SESTC), calling like-minded states and international communities to support Taiwan's democracy, freedom, and the nation's meaningful participation in international organizations and cooperation, such as the World Health Organization, the International Civil Aviation Organization, INTERPOL, the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, and CPTPP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it supports the early start of negotiations on a US-Taiwan Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA), establishing a trade office in Taiwan, as Taiwanese companies are looking for diverse and free markets in the U.S. instead of China.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it urges Alabama and Tawain to sign K-12 and higher education cooperation MOUs aiming at Mandarin-English language exchange programs, encouraging its officials and members of Legislature to conduct more exchanges with their Taiwanese counterparts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Governor Kay Ivey,
