A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State House Trust – Lawyer’s Mall – Commemoration of Landmark Civil Rights**
3 **Case Brown v. Calvert County Board of Education**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State House Trust to add to the list of landmark cases
5 engraved on Lawyer’s Mall in front of the statue of Supreme Court Justice Thurgood
6 Marshall the case of Brown v. Calvert County Board of Education; and generally
7 relating to the commemoration of Brown v. Calvert County Board of Education.

13 Preamble

14 WHEREAS, Harriet Elizabeth Brown, long–time resident of Calvert County and the
15 State of Maryland, was a civil rights pioneer who was instrumental in ensuring pay
16 equality for public school teachers regardless of race; and

17 WHEREAS, In 1937, Ms. Brown and her NAACP attorney, Thurgood Marshall,
18 successfully used the 14th Amendment to challenge the Calvert County Public School
19 System for paying African American teachers significantly less than their white
20 counterparts with the same level of education and experience; and

21 WHEREAS, The landmark case was settled in Ms. Brown’s favor by the Calvert
22 County Board of Education on December 27, 1937, and was a turning point for salary
23 equalization in the State of Maryland; and

24 WHEREAS, The day following the settlement of the case in Ms. Brown’s favor,
25 Maryland Governor Harry W. Nice publicly pledged to support legislation and budget

increases to equalize salaries paid to African American and white teachers across the State;
and

WHEREAS, With the support of Governor Nice, a subsequent victory in federal court, and continued pressure from NAACP teacher pay cases, the General Assembly passed a 1941 law to equalize pay for African American and white teachers; and

WHEREAS, Buoyed by these successes, the NAACP took on unequal teacher salaries, based on race, in school districts across the South; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly believes that it is appropriate to commemorate the case of Brown v. Calvert County Board of Education as a landmark civil rights case successfully fought by a future Associate Justice of the United States, Thurgood Marshall, who is commemorated by a statue on Lawyer's Mall in Annapolis; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Government

9–502.

There is a State House Trust.

9–505.

(a) In addition to any duties set forth elsewhere, the Trust shall:

(1) be responsible for the restoration and preservation of the State House;

(2) be responsible for the landscaping and construction of Lawyer's Mall;

and

(3) disapprove or approve and supervise:

(i) any proposed repair, improvement, or other change to the State House or to any other building within State Circle, including any change to the furnishings or fixtures of those buildings;

(ii) any proposed landscaping of the grounds of those buildings; and

(iii) any proposed improvement, nonemergency repair, or other change to Lawyer's Mall.

(b) The Trust is not required under subsection (a)(2) or (3)(iii) of this section to be responsible for, or disapprove or approve and supervise, the coordination, security, and scheduling of rallies and other events held on Lawyer's Mall.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding §
2 9–505(a)(3)(iii) of the State Government Article, the State House Trust shall add to the list
3 of landmark cases engraved on the grounds of Lawyer’s Mall directly in front of the statue
4 of Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall the 1937 case of Brown v. Calvert County
5 Board of Education.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2022.
