Mr. Casey introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry

A BILL

- To provide funding for targeted purchases of qualified agricultural products from producers that rely on local agricultural food markets affected by COVID-19, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Farmers-Feeding-
 - 5 Families Coronavirus Response Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. TARGETED PURCHASES OF AGRICULTURAL PROD-
- 7 UCTS.
- 8 (a) Definitions.—In this section:

1	(1) Emergency food assistance pro-
2	GRAM.—The term "emergency food assistance pro-
3	gram" means the emergency food assistance pro-
4	gram established under the Emergency Food Assist-
5	ance Act of 1983 (7 U.S.C. 7501 et seq.).
6	(2) QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL PRODUCT.—The
7	term "qualified agricultural product" means a spe-
8	cialty crop, dairy product, meat product, or poultry
9	product—
10	(A) that was packaged, marketed, intended
11	to be harvested, or harvested for sale—
12	(i) to commercial or food service in-
13	dustries; or
14	(ii) through direct-to-consumer, di-
15	rect-to-institution, direct-to-retail, direct-
16	to-restaurant, or direct-to-store marketing
17	channels, including local and regional food
18	enterprises such as food hubs, agricultural
19	cooperatives, and producer associations;
20	and
21	(B) for which decreased demand exists due
22	to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19),
23	as determined by the Secretary.
24	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
25	the Secretary of Agriculture.

(b) Targeted Purchases.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall use not less than \$300,000,000 of the amounts appropriated under section 32 of the Act of August 24, 1935 (7 U.S.C. 612c), to purchase qualified agricultural products to provide to food assistance programs, including the emergency food assistance program.
 - (2) QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS PUR-CHASED.—In carrying out paragraph (1), the Secretary shall use—
 - (A) not less than \$100,000,000 to purchase specialty crops;
 - (B) not less than \$100,000,000 to purchase dairy; and
 - (C) not less than \$100,000,000 to purchase meat and poultry products, including eggs.
 - (3) DIRECT MARKET PRODUCTS.—In carrying out paragraph (1), the Secretary shall, to the maximum extent practicable, use not less than 10 percent of the amount made available under that paragraph to purchase qualified agricultural products that would otherwise be sold through direct-to-consumer, direct-to-institution, direct-to-retail, or direct-to-restaurant marketing channels.

1 (4) Consultation.—If applicable, the Admin2 istrator of the Agricultural Marketing Service shall
3 consult with the Administrator of the Food and Nu4 trition Service in determining which qualified agri5 cultural products to purchase pursuant to this sub6 section.

(c) STATE PURCHASING FUNDS.—

- (1) In General.—In addition to the amounts used under subsection (b), the Secretary shall use not less than \$200,000,000 of the amounts appropriated under section 32 of the Act of August 24, 1935 (7 U.S.C. 612c), to allocate to States, in accordance with paragraph (2), to use for the procurement of additional food products to support State food assistance programs.
- (2) Allocation of funds.—The Secretary shall allocate amounts to States under paragraph (1) according to the formula described in section 251.3(h) of title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (or successor regulations), as applied for fiscal year 2020.
- (3) STATE AGENCY FUND RECIPIENT.—
 Amounts allocated to a State under this subsection shall be provided to the State agency responsible for

1	distributing commodities pursuant to a State plan
2	under the emergency food assistance program.
3	(4) Use of funds.—A State shall use funds
4	allocated under this subsection only—
5	(A) to purchase qualified agricultural prod-
6	ucts—
7	(i) to donate to food assistance pro-
8	grams in the State; or
9	(ii) to transfer directly to an eligible
10	recipient agency (as defined in section
11	201A of the Emergency Food Assistance
12	Act of 1983 (7 U.S.C. 7501));
13	(B) to purchase, lease, or otherwise ac-
14	quire vehicles, including refrigerated vehicles, or
15	other equipment to carry out activities relating
16	to procurement and distribution of qualified ag-
17	ricultural products;
18	(C) to reimburse travel costs relating to
19	procurement of qualified agricultural products
20	at the per mile rate established by the Commis-
21	sioner of the Internal Revenue Service; and
22	(D) to reimburse costs relating to pre-
23	paring, storing, and transporting qualified agri-
24	cultural products, including transportation to or

between eligible recipient agencies, as well as
 delivery to end-consumers.

Each State shall, to the maximum extent practicable, use not less than 10 percent of the amount allocated to the State under this subsection to purchase crops and products that would otherwise be sold through direct-to-consumer, direct-to-institution, direct-to-retail, or direct-to-restaurant marketing channels.
