1 AN ACT concerning

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Natural Resources Police - Conditions of Sentencing, Probation, Parole, or
Mandatory Release Supervision - Database
Task Force to Study Data Sharing Among the Maryland Judiciary, the

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Judiciary to notify the Department of Natural Resources of any person who is subject to a condition of sentencing or probation that specifically prohibits the person from operating a motorized vessel or a sailboat on the waters of the State or any recreational or commercial hunting activity in the State: requiring the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to notify the Department of Natural Resources of any person who is subject to any terms and conditions of parole or mandatory release supervision that specifically prohibit the person from operating a motorized vessel or a sailboat on the waters of the State or any recreational or commercial hunting activity in the State; requiring the Department of Natural Resources to establish and maintain a certain database of the persons reported by the Maryland Judiciary and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services as subject to certain conditions of sentencing, probation. parole, or mandatory release supervision and to ensure that the database is available to Natural Resources police officers; and generally relating to the establishment and maintenance of a Natural Resources police database of persons subject to certain conditions of sentencing, probation, parole, or mandatory release supervision establishing the Task Force to Study Data Sharing Among the Maryland Judiciary, the Maryland Parole Commission, and the Department of Natural Resources; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the
