A BILL

- To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to include guidance on how dependent students with parents without SSNs may obtain Federal student assistance.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "FAFSA for All Act".
 - 5 SEC. 2. FAFSA INFORMATION FOR DEPENDENT STUDENTS
 - 6 WITH PARENTS WITHOUT SSNS.
 - 7 Section 483(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
 - 8 (20 U.S.C. 1090(a)) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (3), by adding at the end the
2	following:
3	"(I) Information for dependent stu-
4	DENTS WITH PARENTS WITHOUT SSNS.—The
5	Secretary shall include on the same website
6	used to provide students with the electronic
7	version of the forms described in this paragraph
8	the guidance described in paragraph
9	(12)(B)(ii)."; and
10	(2) in paragraph (12)—
11	(A) by striking "The Secretary" and in-
12	serting the following:
13	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary"; and
14	(B) by adding at the end the following:
15	"(B) Dependent students with par-
16	ENTS WITHOUT SSNS.—The Secretary shall in-
17	clude on the forms—
18	"(i) questions to determine whether—
19	"(I) a dependent student meets
20	the requirements of section 484(a)(5);
21	and
22	"(II) the parents of a dependent
23	student have a valid social security
24	number; and

1	"(ii) in a case in which a dependent
2	student meets the requirements of section
3	484(a)(5), but whose parents do not have
4	a valid social security number, detailed
5	guidance on how the student may obtain
6	the Federal financial assistance described
7	in paragraph (1), including an online tool
8	that allows the student to upload docu-
9	ments required to receive such assist-
10	ance.".

11 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The amendments made by section 1 shall be effective beginning academic year 2017–2018.
