J21lr0987 CF SB 476 (PRE-FILED) By: Delegate Krebs Requested: October 15, 2020 Introduced and read first time: January 13, 2021 Assigned to: Health and Government Operations Committee Report: Favorable House action: Adopted Read second time: February 18, 2021 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Health Occupations - Nurses - Delegation of Tasks FOR the purpose of providing that an advanced practice registered nurse is not precluded from delegating a nursing or other technical task to an assistant under certain circumstances; providing that a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse is not precluded from delegating a technical task other than a nursing task to an unlicensed individual under certain circumstances; requiring the State Board of Nursing to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to nurses delegating nursing and other technical tasks. BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health Occupations Section 8–6A–02 Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations



- 1 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, an individual shall be certified 2 by the Board to practice as a nursing assistant or medication technician before the 3 individual may practice as a nursing assistant or medication technician in the State.
- 4 (b) This subtitle does not apply to an individual who:
- 5 (1) Practices a health occupation that the individual is authorized to 6 practice under this article;
- 7 (2) Provides for the gratuitous care of friends, domestic partners, or family 8 members;
- 9 (3) Performs nursing assistant tasks while a nursing student enrolled in 10 an accredited nursing program and practicing under the direct supervision of qualified 11 faculty or preceptors;
- 12 (4) Performs nursing assistant tasks as a student while:
- 13 (i) Enrolled in a Board-approved nursing assistant training 14 program; and
- 15 (ii) Practicing under the direct supervision of qualified faculty or 16 preceptors;
- 17 (5) Performs medication technician tasks as a student while practicing 18 under the direct supervision of qualified faculty; or
- 19 (6) Works as a principal or school secretary, does not administer 20 medication as a routine part of the position, and has completed training by the delegating 21 nurse for the occasion where the individual may need to administer medication in the 22 absence of the nurse or medication technician.
- 23 (c) Nothing in this section shall preclude a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse from delegating a nursing **OR OTHER TECHNICAL** task to an unlicensed individual provided that acceptance of delegated nursing **OR OTHER TECHNICAL** tasks does not become a routine part of the unlicensed individual's job duties.
- (D) (1) SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THIS SECTION DOES NOT PRECLUDE AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE FROM DELEGATING A NURSING OR OTHER TECHNICAL TASK TO AN ASSISTANT IF:
- 31 (I) THE ASSISTANT PERFORMS ONLY TASKS THAT THE 32 ASSISTANT IS TRAINED TO PERFORM; AND

$\frac{1}{2}$	(II) THE DELEGATING ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE PROVIDES:
3 4	1. Instruction to the assistant on the delegated task; and
5 6	2. ON-SITE SUPERVISION OF THE ASSISTANT PERFORMING THE DELEGATED TASK.
7 8	(2) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SUBSECTION, INCLUDING REGULATIONS THAT:
9 10 11	(I) PROVIDE FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE DELEGATES A NURSING OR OTHER TECHNICAL TASK TO AN ASSISTANT;
12 13 14	(II) ESTABLISH LIMITATIONS ON THE AUTHORITY OF AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE TO DELEGATE NURSING OR OTHER TECHNICAL TASKS TO AN ASSISTANT; AND
15	(III) OTHERWISE CLARIFY THE SCOPE OF THIS SUBSECTION.
