- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the number of members serving on the Baltimore County 4 Board of Education; requiring the Baltimore County Executive to appoint one 5 member of the county board within a certain period of time; requiring the Baltimore 6 County School Board Nominating Commission to recommend county board nominees 7 to the County Executive; requiring the County Executive to appoint a member of the 8 county board from a list provided by the Commission; requiring the County 9 Executive to return the list of nominees to the Commission in certain circumstances; 10 altering the number of votes required for the members of the Baltimore County 11 Board of Education county board to elect a chair and vice chair; making conforming 12 changes; and generally relating to the membership and election of officers for the 13 Baltimore County Board of Education.
