

22	(i) at least one passenger elevator;				
23	(ii) at least 100 rooms to accommodate the public; and

1 2 3	(3) THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY SELL BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION ONLY WHEN THE LICENSED PREMISES IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS AS A HOTEL OR RESTAURANT.
4 5	(E) THE BOARD MAY LIMIT THE QUANTITY OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES SOLE IN A SINGLE TRANSACTION FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION UNDER THE LICENSE
6 7 8	(e) (F) The Comptroller may issue one Class 8 farm brewery license and one Class 7 micro-brewery license to a license holder that holds not more than five Class B and six Class BLX beer, wine, and liquor licenses.
9	(f) (G) The annual license [fees are:
10	(1) \$1,000 for the Class B beer, wine, and liquor license; and
11	(2) \$500 for the off-sale beer and wine permit] FEE IS \$1,000.
