A BILL

To reauthorize and improve the Department of Defense Mentor-Protégé Program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Defense Small Busi-
- 5 ness Advancement Act of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION AND IMPROVEMENT OF DE-
- 7 PARTMENT OF DEFENSE MENTOR-PROTÉGÉ
- 8 PROGRAM.
- 9 (a) Permanent Authorization.—Section 831 of
- 10 the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year

- 2 amended by striking subsection (j).
- 3 (b) Office of Small Business Programs Over-
- 4 Sight.—Section 831 of the National Defense Authoriza-
- 5 tion Act for Fiscal Year 1991 (Public Law 101–510; 10
- 6 U.S.C. 2302 note) is amended—
- 7 (1) by redesignating subsection (n) as sub-
- 8 section (o); and
- 9 (2) by inserting after subsection (m) the fol-
- 10 lowing new subsection:
- 11 "(n) Establishment of Performance Goals
- 12 AND PERIODIC REVIEWS.—The Office of Small Business
- 13 Programs of the Department of Defense shall establish
- 14 performance goals and conduct periodic reviews of ap-
- 15 proved agreements between mentors and protégés.".
- 16 (c) Removal of Pilot Program References.—
- 17 Section 831 of the National Defense Authorization Act for
- 18 Fiscal Year 1991 (Public Law 101–510; 10 U.S.C. 2302
- 19 note) is amended—
- 20 (1) in the subsection heading for subsection (a),
- 21 by striking "PILOT"; and
- 22 (2) by striking "pilot" each place it appears.
- 23 (d) Independent Report on Program Effec-
- 24 TIVENESS.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than March 31, 2 2022, an independent third party selected by the 3 Department of Defense Office of Small Business 4 Programs shall submit to the congressional defense 5 committees a report evaluating the effectiveness of the Mentor-Protégé Program established under sec-6 7 tion 831 of the National Defense Authorization Act 8 for Fiscal Year 1991 (Public Law 101–510; 10 9 U.S.C. 2302 note), including recommendations for 10 improving the program in terms of performance metrics, forms of assistance, and overall program ef-12 fectiveness.

> Congressional defense COMMITTEES DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term "congressional defense committees" has the meaning given that term in section 101(a)(16) of title 10, United States Code.
