Hearing- or Speech-Impaired Children - Sign Language Instruction for Parents and Guardians

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring an individualized education program for a child with a 5 hearing or speech impairment to include educating the child's parents or guardians 6 in basic sign language, including by certain methods; requiring that the Maryland 7 Infants and Toddlers Program include resources for teaching sign language to 8 certain parents or guardians; requiring the State Department of Education to adopt 9 certain regulations; altering the name of the universal newborn screening program to be the universal newborn screening and parental education program; requiring 10 11 the program to ensure that the parents or guardians of a newborn with hearing loss 12 have a basic understanding of sign language for a certain purpose; requiring the 13 program to include playing of certain pediatric sign language videos in the hospital 14 and providing certain resources to parents and guardians of newborns with hearing loss; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt certain 15 16 regulations; and generally relating to sign language instruction for parents and 17 guardians of children with hearing or speech impairments.

24	(a) (1) There is a Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program in the Department.
25 26 27 28	(2) (I) The purpose of the Program is to provide a statewide, community—based interagency system of comprehensive early intervention services to eligible infants and toddlers, from birth until the beginning of the school year following a child's 4th birthday, and their families.
29 30 31 32	(II) FOR INFANTS AND TODDLERS WITH HEARING OR SPEECH IMPAIRMENTS, THE SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER THE PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE RESOURCES FOR TEACHING SIGN LANGUAGE TO THEIR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS, INCLUDING BY:

1	1. PROVIDING A COURSE IN BASIC SIGN LANGUAGE;
2 3	2. Lending DVDs or other digital format teaching tools; and

10 11	(a) Each hospital that provides obstetrical services shall establish a universal newborn hearing screening AND PARENTAL EDUCATION program to ensure that:
12 13	(1) All newborns born in the hospital are screened for hearing loss before discharge; [and]
14	(2) The results are reported as required under $\S 13-605$ of this article; AND
15 16 17	(3) If a newborn has a hearing loss, the parents or guardians of the newborn have a basic understanding of sign language to help in communicating with the child.
18 19	(b) The universal newborn hearing screening AND PARENTAL EDUCATION program established under this section shall [consist of at] INCLUDE:
20	(1) AT least one of the following screening tests:
21	[(1)] (I) Auditory brain stem response;
22	[(2)] (II) Otoacoustic emissions; or
23 24	[(3)] (III) Another appropriate screening test recommended by the Advisory Council and approved by the Secretary; AND
25 26 27	(2) (I) THE PLAYING IN THE HOSPITAL OF PEDIATRIC SIGN LANGUAGE VIDEOS THAT TEACH PARENTS AND GUARDIANS OF NEWBORNS WITH HEARING LOSS BASIC SIGNS; AND

- 1 (II) THE PROVISION OF FREE SIGN LANGUAGE RESOURCE 2 GUIDES FOR THE PARENTS AND GUARDIANS OF NEWBORNS WITH HEARING LOSS.
- 3 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 4 SECTION.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2017.
