CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Alcoholic Beverages – License Extensions**

3 FOR the purpose of extending for a certain amount of time the expiration dates of certain
4 alcoholic beverages licenses in Baltimore City that are issued for certain areas for
5 certain transfer and renewal purposes under certain circumstances; and generally
6 relating to alcoholic beverages in Baltimore City.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
8 That:

9 (a) Notwithstanding § 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article,
10 a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 5517 block of Harford Road shall be
11 considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purpose of being transferred to
12 another owner at the same location, if the applicant enters into a memorandum of
13 understanding with the Hamilton Community Association.

14 (b) (1) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis
15 Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 2200 block of East Fayette Street
16 shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purposes of being
17 renewed to the current license year and transferred to a different applicant at the same
18 location, if the applicant enters into a memorandum of understanding with the Cleaning,
19 Active, Restoring, Efforts (C.A.R.E.) Community Association.

20 (2) The memorandum of understanding shall:

(i) establish a community input process for the transfer of the license;

(ii) limit the license to the sale of beer and wine only during the first 12 months of operation immediately following the transfer;

(iii) include public safety measures relating to:

1. parking;

2. lighting;

3. music;

4. noise;

5. cameras; and

6. trash; and

(iv) prohibit the license from being transferred to a new location.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of July 31, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
