BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Election Law Section 10–301.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2017 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Election Law
