A BILL

To amend the renewable fuel program under the Clean Air Act to account for small refinery exemptions in past calendar years, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. ACCOUNTING FOR SMALL REFINERY EXEMP
TIONS FROM RENEWABLE FUEL REQUIRE
MENTS IN PAST CALENDAR YEARS.

Section 211(o)(9) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.

7545(o)(9)) is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(E) ACCOUNTING FOR FULL VOLUME OF

EXEMPTIONS FOR 2006 THROUGH 2018.—

1	"(i) Study of previous years.—
2	Not later than 30 days after the date of
3	enactment of this subparagraph, the Ad-
4	ministrator shall—
5	"(I) complete a study to deter-
6	mine, for each of calendar years 2006
7	through 2018, the overall reduction in
8	the national quantity of renewable
9	fuel that was sold or introduced in
10	interstate commerce as a result of ex-
11	emptions granted to small refineries
12	under this paragraph; and
13	"(II) submit a report to the Con-
14	gress containing the results of such
15	study.
16	"(ii) Reallocating shortfalls to
17	FUTURE YEARS.—The Administrator shall
18	increase the applicable volume of renewable
19	fuel required under paragraph (2) by add-
20	ing the reductions found, pursuant to
21	clause (i), to have occurred across calendar
22	years 2006 through 2018, to the applicable
23	volume required under paragraph (2) for

1	future calendar years,	beginning	with	cal-
2	endar year 2019.".
