AN ACT

To provide competitive grants for the promotion of Japanese American confinement education as a means to understand the importance of democratic principles, use and abuse of power, and to raise awareness about the importance of cultural tolerance toward Japanese Americans, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Japanese American
- 3 Confinement Education Act Norman Y. Mineta Japanese
- 4 American Confinement Education Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. JAPANESE AMERICAN CONFINEMENT EDUCATION
- 6 GRANTS.
- 7 Public Law 109–441 (120 Stat. 3290) is amended—
- 8 (1) in section 2, by adding at the end the fol-
- 9 lowing:
- 10 "(4) Japanese American Confinement Edu-
- 11 CATION GRANTS.—The term 'Japanese American
- 12 Confinement Education Grants' means competitive
- grants, awarded through the Japanese American
- 14 Confinement Sites Program, for Japanese American
- organizations to educate individuals, including
- through the use of digital resources, in the United
- 17 States on the historical importance of Japanese
- 18 American confinement during World War II, so that
- present and future generations may learn from Jap-
- anese American confinement and the commitment of
- 21 the United States to equal justice under the law.
- 22 "(5) Japanese American Organization.—
- The term 'Japanese American organization' means a
- private nonprofit organization within the United
- 25 States established to promote the understanding and
- appreciation of the ethnic and cultural diversity of

5	(A) by inserting "(a) In General.—" be

12	"(1) In General.—Of the amounts made					
13	available under this section, not more than					
14	\$10,000,000 shall be awarded as Japanese American					
15	Confinement Education Grants to Japanese Amer					
16	ican organizations. Such competitive grants shall be					
17	in an amount not less than \$750,000 and the Sec					
18	retary shall give priority consideration to Japanese					
19	American organizations with fewer than 100 employ-

21	"(2) Matching requirement.—					
22	"(A) FIFTY PERCENT.—Except as pro-					
23	vided in subparagraph (B), for funds awarded					
24	under this subsection, the Secretary shall re-					
25	guire a 50 percent match with non-Federal as-					

1	sets from non-Federal sources, which may in-				
2	clude cash or durable goods and materials fairly				
3	valued, as determined by the Secretary.				
4	"(B) WAIVER.—The Secretary may waive				
5	all or part of the matching requirement under				
6	subparagraph (A), if the Secretary determines

8	"(i) no reasonable means are available				
9	through which an applicant can meet the				
10	matching requirement; and				
11	"(ii) the probable benefit of the				
12	project funded outweighs the public inter-				
13	est in such matching requirement.".
