## A BILL

To ensure that low-income college students are eligible for emergency supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Emergency Ensuring
- 5 Access to SNAP (EATS) Act of 2020".

### 1 SEC. 2. SNAP PREVENTING HUNGER AMONG LOW-INCOME

2	COLLEGE STUDENTS.
3	Beginning with the first month that begins after the
4	date of the enactment of this Act, and for each subsequent
5	month through the end of the month following—
6	(1) the month the current public health emer-
7	gency declaration by the Secretary of Health and
8	Human Services under section 319 of the Public
9	Health Service Act based on an outbreak of
10	coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) is termi-
11	nated, or
12	(2) the end of the first college term following
13	the end of such public health emergency,
14	whichever is later, eligibility for supplemental nutrition as-
15	sistance program benefits shall not be limited under sec-
16	tion 6(e) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C.
17	2015(e)).
