

- 4 SECURITY OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE STATE BY IMPLEMENTING A STATEWIDE

- 6 PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL PERSONNEL, A PUBLIC SAFETY

- 15 OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE CERTIFIED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND
- 16 SECURITY UNDER THE FEDERAL SUPPORT ANTI-TERRORISM BY FOSTERING

- 18 (F) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2026, THE CENTER SHALL ENSURE
- 19 THAT THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED IN EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE
- 20 **STATE.**
- 21 (2) (I) A PUBLIC SCHOOL WITH AN EXISTING PROGRAM THAT IS
- 22 SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM MAY SUBMIT A REQUEST TO THE
- 23 CENTER TO OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM.
- 24 (II) IF THE CENTER DETERMINES THAT A PUBLIC SCHOOL'S
- 25 EXISTING PROGRAM IS SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM, THE CENTER
- 26 SHALL GRANT THE SCHOOL'S REQUEST TO OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM.
- 27 (G) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE
- 28 ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$4,500,000 FOR THE PROGRAM.

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- 1 (iii) transfers 9-1-1 requests for emergency services or transmits 2 incident data to:

- 6 2. an appropriate public safety answering point located 7 within or outside the State.
