SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That: The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall provide a progress report on the status of the implementation of the recommendations of the Abuser Registry Workgroup, which was originally convened in 2012 and reconvened by Chapter 239 of 2013. Specifically, the Department shall report on: (b) the creation of a definition of "abuse" that is universal throughout the Maryland Annotated Code;
