- 20 "(a) Authorization of Transfer of Equip-
- 21 MENT.—During a public health emergency declared by the
- 22 Secretary of Health and Human Services under section
- 23 319(a) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
- 24 247d(a)), the Secretary, at the request of the Secretary of
- 25 Health and Human Services, may transfer to the Depart-

1	ment of Health and Human Services, on a reimbursable
2	basis, excess personal protective equipment or medically
3	necessary equipment in the possession of the Department.
4	"(b) Determination by Secretaries.—
5	"(1) In general.—In carrying out this sec-
6	tion—
7	"(A) before requesting a transfer under sub-
8	section (a), the Secretary of Health and Human
9	Services shall determine whether the personal
10	protective equipment or medically necessary
11	equipment is otherwise available; and
12	"(B) before initiating a transfer under sub-
13	section (a), the Secretary, in consultation with
14	the heads of each component within the Depart-
15	ment, shall—
16	"(i) determine whether the personal
17	protective equipment or medically necessary
18	equipment requested to be transferred under
19	subsection (a) is excess equipment; and
20	"(ii) certify that the transfer of the
21	personal protective equipment or medically
22	necessary equipment will not adversely im-
23	pact the health or safety of officers, employ-
24	ees, or contractors of the Department.

1	"(2) Notification.—The Secretary of Health
2	and Human Services and the Secretary shall each
3	submit to Congress a notification explaining the de-
4	termination made under subparagraphs (A) and (B),
5	respectively, of paragraph (1).
6	"(3) Required inventory.—
7	"(A) In general.—The Secretary shall—
8	"(i) acting through the Chief Medical
9	Officer of the Department, maintain an in-
10	ventory of all personal protective equipment
11	and medically necessary equipment in the
12	possession of the Department; and
13	"(ii) make the inventory required
14	under clause (i) available, on a continual
15	basis, to—
16	"(I) the Secretary of Health and
17	Human Services; and
18	"(II) the Committee on Appro-
19	priations and the Committee on Home-
20	land Security and Governmental Af-
21	fairs of the Senate and the Committee
22	on Appropriations and the Committee
23	on Homeland Security of the House of
24	Representatives.

1	"(B) FORM.—Each inventory required to be
2	made available under subparagraph (A) shall be
3	submitted in unclassified form, but may include
4	a classified annex.".

13	"(6) Transfers of items.—The Secretary, in
14	coordination with the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
15	rity, may sell drugs, vaccines and other biological
16	products, medical devices, or other supplies main-
17	tained in the stockpile under paragraph (1) to a Fed-
18	eral agency or private, nonprofit, State, local, tribal,
19	or territorial entity for immediate use and distribu-
20	tion, provided that any such items being sold are—
21	"(A) within 1 year of their expiration date;
22	or
23	"(B) determined by the Secretary to no
24	longer be needed in the stockpile due to advances
25	in medical or technical capabilities.".

7	SEC. 530. NATIONAL STRATEGIC STOCKPILE OF PERSONAL						
8	PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT FOR FIRST RE-						
9	SPONDERS.						
10	"(a) Definitions.—In this section—						
11	"(1) the term 'first responder' means a 'publi						
12	safety officer' as defined in section 1204 of title I of						
13	the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of						
14	1968 (34 U.S.C. 10284); and						
15	"(2) the term 'personal protective equipment' in-						
16	cludes protective clothing, helmets, gloves, face shields,						
17	goggles, face masks, and other supplies or equipment						
18	designed to protect the wearer from injury or the						
19	spread of infection or illness, as the Secretary deter						
20	mines appropriate.						
21	"(b) Authorization.—						
22	"(1) In General.—The Secretary may—						
23	"(A) establish and maintain a stockpile of						
24	personal protective equipment for use by first re-						
25	sponders during an emergency declared under						
26	section 501(b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster						

1 Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 2 5191(b)) or under the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 et seg.); and 3 4 "(B) make such personal protective equipment available, on a reimbursable basis, to first 5 6 responder agencies. 7 "(2) Determination of Secretary.—The Sec-8 retary shall, in consultation with the Secretary of 9 Health and Human Services, determine what quantities of equipment shall be appropriate to maintain 10 11 the stockpile authorized under paragraph (1). 12 "(c) Reimbursement.—In lieu of reimbursement from a first responder agency under subsection (b), the Secretary may accept reimbursement from the State, or political subdivision thereof, in which the first responder agency 16 is located. 17 "(d) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall submit to 18 19 Congress a report on the progress made on establishing a stockpile under this section, including the quantity of mate-20 21 rials that have been obtained and a description of the plans of the Department to maintain the stockpile.". 23 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—The table of contents in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security
