### A BILL

To reauthorize the United States-Jordan Defense Cooperation Act of 2015, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "United States-Jordan
- 5 Defense Cooperation Extension Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:

- 1 (1) In December 2011, Congress passed section
  2 7041(b) of the Consolidated Appropriations Act,
  3 2012 (Public Law 112–74; 125 Stat. 1223), which
  4 appropriated funds made available under the head5 ing "Economic Support Fund" to establish an enter6 prise fund for Jordan.
  - (2) The intent of an enterprise fund is to attract private investment to help entrepreneurs and small businesses create jobs and to achieve sustainable economic development.
  - (3) Jordan is an instrumental partner in the fight against terrorism, including as a member of the Global Coalition To Counter ISIS and the Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve.
  - (4) In 2014, His Majesty King Abdullah stated that "Jordanians and Americans have been standing shoulder to shoulder against extremism for many years, but to a new level with this coalition against ISIL".
  - (5) On February 3, 2015, the United States signed a 3-year memorandum of understanding with Jordan, pledging to provide the kingdom with \$1,000,000,000 annually in United States foreign assistance, subject to the approval of Congress.

#### 1 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

2	It is the sense of Congress that—
3	(1) Jordan plays a critical role in responding to
4	the overwhelming humanitarian needs created by the
5	conflict in Syria; and
6	(2) Jordan, the United States, and other part-
7	ners should continue working together to address
8	this humanitarian crisis and promote regional sta-
9	bility, including through support for refugees in Jor-
10	dan and internally displaced people along the Jor-
11	dan-Syria border and the creation of conditions in-
12	side Syria that will allow for the secure, dignified,
13	and voluntary return of people displaced by the cri-
14	sis.
15	SEC. 4. REAUTHORIZATION OF UNITED STATES-JORDAN
16	DEFENSE COOPERATION ACT OF 2015.
17	Section 5(a) of the United States-Jordan Defense Co-
18	operation Act of 2015 (22 U.S.C. 2753 note) is amend-
19	ed—
20	(1) by striking "During the 3-year period" and
21	inserting "During the period"; and
22	(2) by inserting "and ending on December 31,
23	2022" after "enactment of this Act".

1	SEC. 5. REPORT ON ESTABLISHING AN ENTERPRISE FUND
2	FOR JORDAN.
3	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
4	establishment of the United States Development Finance
5	Corporation, the President shall submit to the appropriate
6	congressional committees a detailed report assessing the
7	costs and benefits of the United States Development Fi-
8	nance Corporation establishing a Jordan Enterprise Fund
9	(b) Appropriate Congressional Committees.—
10	In this section, the term "appropriate congressional com-
11	mittees" means—
12	(1) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
13	the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate; and
14	(2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
15	Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
16	resentatives
