BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Utilities 7 - 703. **(1)** The required percentage of an electric cooperative's renewable energy portfolio standard derived from solar energy shall be 2.5% in 2020 and later. **(2)** THE REQUIRED PERCENTAGE OF A MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC UTILITY'S RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARD SHALL BE:
