A BILL

To increase accountability, combat corruption, and strengthen management effectiveness at the World Bank.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the 'World Bank Account-
5	ability Act of 2017".
6	SEC. 2. WITHHOLDING OF FUNDS UNTIL CERTAIN CONDI-
7	TIONS ARE MET.
8	(a) Institutional Reforms.—
9	(1) In general.—With respect to each of fiscal
10	years 2018 through 2023, in addition to any amounts
11	withheld from disbursement under subsection (b), 15
12	percent of the amounts provided in appropriations
13	Acts for the International Development Association
14	for the fiscal year—
15	(A) shall be withheld from disbursement
16	until the conditions of paragraph (2) or (3) are
17	satisfied; and
18	(B)(i) shall be disbursed after the conditions
19	of paragraph (2) are satisfied; and
20	(ii) may be disbursed after the conditions of
21	paragraph (3) are satisfied
22	(2) Initial conditions.—The conditions of this
23	paragraph are satisfied with respect to the amounts
24	provided in appropriations Acts for a fiscal year if,
25	in the fiscal year, the Secretary of the Treasury re-

- ports to the appropriate congressional committees that the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development—
 - (A) is implementing institutional incentives, including through formal staff evaluation criteria, that prioritize poverty reduction, development outcomes, and capable project management over the volume of the Bank's lending and grantmaking;
 - (B) is taking steps to address the management failures described in Inspection Panel Investigation Report 106710–UG, and to prevent their recurrence in countries that are eligible for World Bank support; and
 - (C) is taking measures to strengthen its management of trust funds, with the goal of increasing the accountability of the trust funds for poverty reduction and development outcomes.
 - (3) Subsequent conditions.—The conditions of this paragraph are satisfied if the Secretary of the Treasury reports to the appropriate congressional committees, in each of the 3 fiscal years most recently preceding the fiscal year in which the report is made, that the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development has instituted the measures described in

1	paragraph (2) of this subsection and the measures de-
2	scribed in subsection $(b)(2)$.
3	(b) Governance and Anticorruption Reforms.—
4	(1) In general.—With respect to each of fiscal
5	years 2018 through 2023, in addition to any amounts
6	withheld from disbursement under subsection (a), 15
7	percent of the amounts provided in appropriations
8	Acts for the International Development Association
9	for the fiscal year—
10	(A) shall be withheld from disbursement
11	until the conditions of paragraph (2) or (3) are
12	satisfied; and
13	(B)(i) shall be disbursed after the conditions
14	of paragraph (2) are satisfied; and
15	(ii) may be disbursed after the conditions of
16	paragraph (3) are satisfied
17	(2) Initial conditions.—The conditions of this
18	paragraph are satisfied with respect to the amounts
19	provided in appropriations Acts for a fiscal year if,
20	in the fiscal year, the Secretary of the Treasury re-
21	ports to the appropriate congressional committees that
22	the International Bank for Reconstruction and Devel-
23	opment—
24	(A) is emphasizing in appropriate oper-
25	ational policies, directives, and country strate-

1	gies its support for secure property rights, due
2	process of law, and economic freedom as essential
3	conditions for sustained poverty reduction in
4	World Bank borrowing countries;
5	(B)(i) in the preceding fiscal year, has not
6	approved any loans or grants assistance by the
7	Bank to a country designated by the United
8	States as a state sponsor of terrorism; and
9	(ii) is strengthening the ability of Bank-
10	funded projects to undermine violent extremism;
11	(C) is taking steps to conduct forensic au-
12	dits of projects receiving assistance from the
13	Bank, increase the number of the forensic audits,
14	and strengthen the capacity of the Bank's Integ-
15	rity Vice Presidency, and that not less than 50
16	percent of the forensic audits initiated by the
17	Bank in each fiscal year are of projects ran-
18	domly selected from among International Devel-
19	opment Association borrowing countries; and
20	(D) is taking measures to detect and mini-
21	mize corruption in all World Bank projects in-
22	volving development policy lending.
23	(3) Subsequent conditions.—The conditions
24	of this paragraph are satisfied if the Secretary of the
25	Treasury reports to the appropriate congressional

- 1 committees, in each of the 3 fiscal years most recently
- 2 preceding the fiscal year in which the report is made
- 3 that the International Bank for Reconstruction and
- 4 Development has instituted the measures described in
- 5 paragraph (2) of this subsection and the measures de-
- 6 scribed in subsection (a)(2).
- 7 (c) Appropriate Congressional Committees De-
- 8 FINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate congres-
- 9 sional committees" means the Committees on Financial
- 10 Services and on Appropriations of the House of Representa-
- 11 tives and the Committees on Foreign Relations and on Ap-
- 12 propriations of the Senate.
- 13 SEC. 3. REPORTS TO CONGRESS.
- 14 The Chairman of the National Advisory Council on
- 15 International Monetary and Financial Policies shall in-
- 16 clude in the report required by section 1701 of the Inter-
- 17 national Financial Institutions Act for each of fiscal years
- 18 2018 through 2023 a detailed description of the actions un-
- 19 dertaken by the International Bank for Reconstruction and
- 20 Development in the fiscal year covered by the report to in-
- 21 stitute the measures described in subsections (a)(2) and
- 22 (b)(2) of section 2 of this Act.

1	SEC. 4. OPPOSITION TO WORLD BANK ASSISTANCE FOR
2	GOVERNMENT THAT FAILS TO IMPLEMENT
3	OR ENFORCE MEASURES REQUIRED UNDER
4	AN APPLICABLE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY
5	COUNCIL RESOLUTION.
6	The Bretton Woods Agreements Act (22 U.S.C. 286 et
7	seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following:
8	"SEC. 73. OPPOSITION TO ASSISTANCE FOR GOVERNMENT
9	THAT FAILS TO IMPLEMENT OR ENFORCE
10	MEASURES REQUIRED UNDER AN APPLICA-
11	BLE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL
12	RESOLUTION.
13	"The Secretary of the Treasury should instruct the
14	United States Executive Director at the International Bank
15	for Reconstruction and Development to use the voice and
16	vote of the United States to oppose the provision of assist-
17	ance to the government of a borrowing country of the Inter-
18	national Development Association if the President of the
19	United States determines that the government has know-
20	ingly failed to implement or enforce sanctions required
21	under an applicable United Nations Security Council reso-
22	lution (as defined in section 3 of the North Korea Sanctions
23	and Policy Enhancement Act of 2016 (Public Law 114–
24	122: 22 U.S.C. 9202)) that is in effect.".

- 2 NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION; RE-
- 3 DUCTION FROM IDA-17 AUTHORIZED LEVEL.
- 4 The International Development Association Act (22
- 5 U.S.C. 284 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the
- 6 following:
- 7 "SEC. 30. EIGHTEENTH REPLENISHMENT.
- 8 "(a) Contribution Authority.—The United States
- 9 Governor of the International Development Association
- 10 may contribute on behalf of the United States
- 11 \$3,291,030,000 to the eighteenth replenishment of the re-
- 12 sources of the Association, subject to obtaining the necessary
- 13 appropriations.
- 14 "(b) Limitations on Authorization of Appropria-
- 15 Tions.—In order to pay for the contribution provided for
- 16 in subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated,
- 17 without fiscal year limitation, \$3,291,030,000 for payment
- 18 by the Secretary of the Treasury.".
