BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Business Regulation Section 19-702.1(b) and 19-703 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Business Regulation** 19-702.1.

14 15	(1) the Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General on reasonable notice;
16	(2) any bona fide prospective purchaser on request;
17	(3) the purchaser at the time of a sale; and
18	(4) an animal control unit.
