- 13 (f) Assistance in the repayment of a loan from an entity set forth in § 14 18–1501(c)(2) of this subtitle shall require the approval of the Office.
- 15 (g) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, the Office shall assist
  16 in the repayment of the amount of any higher education loan owed by a licensed clinical
  17 alcohol and drug counselor, a licensed clinical marriage and family therapy counselor, or a
  18 licensed clinical professional counselor whose practice is located in a high–need geographic
  19 area of the State as determined by the Maryland Department of Health.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
