A BILL

To address the financial exploitation of veterans receiving pension from the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veteran Pension Pro-
- 5 tection Act of 2019".

8	tematically soliciting and collecting information on com-
9	plaints received, referrals made, and actions taken by the
10	pension management centers of the Department of Vet-
11	erans Affairs and any other relevant components of the
12	Department, in cases of potential financial exploitation of
13	individuals receiving pension under chapter 15 of title 38,
14	United States Code.
15	(b) Plan To Assess and Address Financial Ex-
16	PLOITATION OF VETERANS.—
17	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall develop
18	and periodically update a plan—
19	(A) to regularly assess the information so-
20	licited and collected under subsection (a) to
21	identify trends of potential financial exploitation
22	of the individuals described in subsection (a)

25	can take to improve education and training to
26	address those trends.

8	tions, an outreach plan for educating vulnerable individ-
9	uals about potential financial exploitation relating to the
10	receipt of pension under chapter 15 of title 38, United
11	States Code.
12	(b) Submission to Congress.—Not later than 180
13	days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Under
14	Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Veterans' Af-
15	fairs and the Special Committee on Aging of the Senate
16	and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of
17	Representatives the plan developed under subsection (a).
18	(c) Veterans Service Organization Defined.—
19	In this section, the term "veterans service organization"
20	means an organization recognized by the Secretary of Vet-
21	erans Affairs for the representation of veterans under sec-
22	tion 5902 of title 38, United States Code.
