- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

11 **DIVISION A—FURTHER ADDITIONAL**

12 **CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS ACT, 2022**

- 13 Sec. 101. The Continuing Appropriations Act, 2022
- 14 (division A of Public Law 117–43) is further amended—
- 15 (1) by striking the date specified in section
- 16 106(3) and inserting "March 11, 2022";
- 17 (2) in section 163, by striking "\$200,000,000"
- and inserting "\$300,000,000"; and
- 19 (3) by adding after section 163 the following
- 20 new sections:

- 1 "Sec. 164. Notwithstanding sections 102 and 104,
- 2 amounts made available by section 101 to the Department
- 3 of Defense for 'Shipbuilding and Conversion, Navy' may
- 4 be apportioned up to the rate for operations necessary for
- 5 'Columbia Class Submarine (AP)' in an amount not to ex-
- 6 ceed \$1,601,805,000.
- 7 "Sec. 165. (a) Notwithstanding sections 101 and
- 8 106 of this Act, for the duration of fiscal year 2022,
- 9 amounts made available in fiscal year 2022 to the Depart-
- 10 ment of Defense under the heading 'Operation and Main-
- 11 tenance', other than amounts designated by the Congress
- 12 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-
- 13 tion 4001(a)(1) and section 4001(b) of S. Con. Res. 14
- 14 (117th Congress), the concurrent resolution on the budget
- 15 for fiscal year 2022, may be used for emergencies and ex-
- 16 traordinary expenses, in addition to any other funds spe-
- 17 cifically made available for such expenses, for purposes the
- 18 Secretary of Defense or the Secretary of the Navy, as ap-
- 19 propriate, determines to be proper with regard to the re-
- 20 sponse to the disruption of the water supply near the Red
- 21 Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, on O'ahu, Hawaii, in ac-
- 22 cordance with 10 U.S.C. 127, in an amount not to exceed
- 23 \$53,000,000: Provided, That not later than 30 days after
- 24 the date of enactment of the Further Additional Con-
- 25 tinuing Appropriations Act, 2022 and every 30 days there-

- 1 after through fiscal year 2022, the Secretary of Defense
- 2 shall submit a report to the Committees on Appropriations
- 3 of the House of Representatives and Senate, setting forth
- 4 all categories and amounts of obligations and expenditures
- 5 made under the authority provided by this subsection.
- 6 "(b) In addition to amounts otherwise provided by
- 7 this Act, there is appropriated to the Department of De-
- 8 fense \$250,000,000, for an additional amount for fiscal
- 9 year 2022, for necessary expenses to address drinking
- 10 water contamination at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage
- 11 Facility in Hawaii, for the accounts and in the amounts
- 12 specified:
- 13 "'Military Personnel, Army', \$33,263,000, to
- remain available until September 30, 2022;
- 15 "'Military Personnel, Navy', \$91,327,000, to
- remain available until September 30, 2022;
- 17 "'Military Personnel, Marine Corps',
- \$5,206,000, to remain available until September 30,
- 19 2022;
- 20 "'Military Personnel, Air Force', \$27,564,000,
- 21 to remain available until September 30, 2022;
- 22 "'Operation and Maintenance, Army',
- \$22,640,000, to remain available until September
- 24 30, 2022; and

- 1 "'Operation and Maintenance, Navy',
- 2 \$70,000,000, to remain available until September
- 3 30, 2022.
- 4 "(c) In addition to amounts otherwise provided by
- 5 this Act, there is appropriated to the Department of De-
- 6 fense \$100,000,000, for an additional amount for fiscal
- 7 year 2022, to remain available until expended, for transfer
- 8 only to accounts under the headings 'Operation and Main-
- 9 tenance', 'Procurement', 'Research, Development, Test
- 10 and Evaluation', and 'Defense Working Capital Funds',
- 11 for the Secretary of Defense to conduct activities in com-
- 12 pliance with the State of Hawaii Department of Health
- 13 Order 21-UST-EA-02, signed December 6, 2021, related
- 14 to the removal of fuel from and improvement of infrastruc-
- 15 ture at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility: Provided,
- 16 That the transfer authority provided in this subsection is
- 17 in addition to any other transfer authority available to the
- 18 Department of Defense: Provided further, That amounts
- 19 provided in this subsection shall not be available for trans-
- 20 fer, obligation, or expenditure until the Secretary of De-
- 21 fense briefs the Committees on Appropriations of the
- 22 House of Representatives and Senate regarding the rec-
- 23 ommendations of the third-party assessment of the oper-
- 24 ations and system integrity of the Red Hill facility and
- 25 the Department's own analysis regarding the distribution

- 1 of fuel reserves for operations in the Pacific theater, as
- 2 well as other activities recommended by the third-party as-
- 3 sessment or Departmental analysis: Provided further, That
- 4 not less than 15 days prior to any transfer of funds pursu-
- 5 ant to this subsection, the Secretary of Defense shall no-
- 6 tify the congressional defense committees of the details of
- 7 any such transfer: Provided further, That not later than
- 8 60 days after the date of enactment of the Further Addi-
- 9 tional Continuing Appropriations Act, 2022 and every 30
- 10 days thereafter through fiscal year 2023, the Secretary of
- 11 Defense shall submit a report to the Committees on Ap-
- 12 propriations of the House of Representatives and Senate,
- 13 setting forth all categories and amounts of obligations and
- 14 expenditures made under the authority provided by this
- 15 subsection.
- "Sec. 166. Amounts made available by section 101
- 17 to the Department of the Interior under the heading
- 18 'Working Capital Fund' may be apportioned up to the rate
- 19 for operations necessary to implement enterprise cyberse-
- 20 curity safeguards.".

- 23 Guidelines set forth in the joint explanatory statement of
