## A BILL

To waive the passport fees for first responders proceeding abroad to aid a foreign country suffering from a natural disaster.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "First Responders Pass-
- 5 port Act of 2017".

## 1 SEC. 2. PASSPORTS FOR FIRST RESPONDERS.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) of section 1 of the
- 3 Act of June 4, 1920 (22 U.S.C. 214; 41 Stat. 750; com-
- 4 monly referred to as the "Passport Act of 1920"), is
- 5 amended, in the third sentence, by inserting after "to at-
- 6 tend a funeral or memorial service for such member;" the
- 7 following: "from an individual who is operating under a
- 8 contract, grant, or cooperative agreement with the United
- 9 States Government, including a volunteer, who is pro-
- 10 ceeding abroad to aid a foreign country suffering from a
- 11 natural disaster as determined by the Secretary;".
- 12 (b) Report.—Not later than 90 days after the end
- 13 of the first full fiscal year after the date of the enactment
- 14 of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to the
- 15 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representa-
- 16 tives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Sen-
- 17 ate a report on the number of waivers of fees for the exe-
- 18 cution and issuance of passports to first responders under
- 19 section 1 of the Act of June 4, 1920, as amended by sub-
- 20 section (a) of this section, for such fiscal year.
