BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 11 12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 Article - Tax - Property 7-207. 14 15 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 16 "Blind individual" means an individual who has a permanent **(2)** 17 impairment of both eyes that causes: 18 (i) central visual acuity, with corrective glasses, of 20/200 or less in 19 the better eye; or 20 (ii) central visual acuity of more than 20/200 if there is a field defect in which the peripheral field has contracted so that the widest diameter of visual field 2122 subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees in the better eye.
