- 22 (5) SUBMIT MONTHLY REPORTS IN WRITING TO THE BOARD OF THE 23 INSPECTOR'S ACTIVITIES, SETTING FORTH COMPLAINTS AND LISTING VIOLATIONS 24 THAT THE INSPECTOR OBSERVED OR THAT WERE REPORTED TO THE INSPECTOR; 25 AND
- 26 (6) CONDUCT COMPLIANCE CHECKS RELATING TO THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS IN VIOLATION OF § 6–304 OF THIS ARTICLE FOR EVERY LICENSED PREMISES IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.
